Looking Backward, last year provided a combination of possibilities and obstructions for Yelm Food Cooperative. We began the year with positive profit margins, but sales subsequently lagged early and often. Overall, last year was okay, and the wine department experienced an increase of nearly 25% last year. Unfortunately, we lost a major part of a large buy club account, and store sales outside of wine were almost the same as last year. In addition, growing expenses in payroll and small equipment purchases negatively affected our cash flow as well.

Around the middle of the year, we also learned that we had to restructure our business due to no fault of our own. This process took a lot of our time away from store development and maintenance. Nevertheless, we believe firmly that a successful 2017 can happen despite the distractions that we still continue to face.

One of the biggest changes involves membership. We now have an equity-based structure for membership that will include either a full share payment of \$100 or installment payments of \$25/year. We have also chosen to give credit to members who had YC memberships that extended into 2017. That credit is based upon how many months in 2017 the YC membership is valid and which payment level the membership is on. Some people get a free membership for 2017 due to the fact that the old member levels were higher than the new levels for the most part. Unfortunately, senior and working member discounts on membership have been removed which is similar to haw it was before the membership changed in 2012. Please make

your membership payment soon, however, if you are a YC member, because your credit will decline every month.

Just like many of our shoppers, we believe that barista and deli services could benefit the store and customers alike. This possibility is nearing reality as we prepare for a launch in spring of a major store remodel. We still face a lot of work ahead before this upgrade becomes a reality, but I feel confident that we can provide superior food and beverages from our current location. Originally, I proposed a remodel that would cost about

\$150,000 to our Board of Directors. Although the proposal received a lot of support, the idea had some logistical issues which led to the scaled-down upgrade that we now hope will happen very soon. Please stay tuned for future details.

Some other changes with the business in 2017 include modifications to our newsletter and marketing. 2016 gave us the chance to better determine what type of marketing seems to work best for the store, and we will move forward with those ideas. With the newsletter, our




