Cooperative Building is a Team Effort General Managers' Report



Every year Yelm Food Cooperative (YFC) has two particular days that hold a special place for the store. The first day is our birthday which happens on April 27th. The other one involves our Annual General Meeting. We usually have activities and special promotions for our birthday celebration. The Annual General Meeting (AGM), however, contains more of an atmosphere for reflecting on our past while looking forward to the future. Unfortunately, attendance for most grocery cooperative AGMs usually equal only about 1% of their entire member base. YFC's AGM attendance is similar to this trend with usually less than 50 members attending. This makes sense considering that most shoppers simply want a grocery cooperative to shop at. On the other hand, YFC will need volunteer support for years to come. To that end, we strongly encourage our members to attend the AGM in an effort to become more involved in the store. For example, even though we have a caring and committed board of directors, we also have key directors who plan to leave their position as early as this October. Moreover, if we had more folk expressing interest in joining our board of directors, we could have more diversity with potential board members.

And the future of YFC faces numerous challenges and even potential threats to our survival. The Amazon/Whole Foods merger got approved much faster than what I originally expected, and now Google and Wal-Mart have begun to partner together in response to Amazon. This dynamic has brought new meaning to, "The High Cost of Low Prices." Certainly, both Amazon and Wal-Mart will start the race by lowering prices on key products during the short term while they squeeze as many companies as they can out of the industry. After that, the normal tendency by these big box retailers involves increasing prices when there is no other competition around that may threaten their virtual monopoly. Moreover, many warehouses, manufacturers, local producers, and farmers end up shouldering the actual loss of revenue caused by lower retail prices. In the end, it is the suppliers that end-up bankrupt due to this price leveraging.
